To record volunteers in County Departments for October 2005. The list is on file in the Human Resources Department.

Commissioner Kolbe joined the meeting.

Commissioner Zweep left the meeting.

The Commission also considered a request to fill two Caseworker vacancies in Human Services. Hugh Grogan, Human Services Director, reported that the positions were vacated in August. Caseloads have been shifted to the remaining employees and they are seeing more requests at this time of year. The positions have been advertised. MOTION by Pekas, seconded by Hajek to authorize the hire of one Caseworker I for the Human Services Department immediately, with the second to be hired November 22nd. 4 ayes.

Commissioner Zweep returned to the meeting.

NOTICES

Notice of Surface Water Discharge Application and Recommendation was received from the SD Department of Environment and Natural Resources for the renewal of a Surface Water Discharge Permit for the City of Crooks.

Notice was received of the East Dakota Water Development District Regular Board Meeting on October 20, 2005.

LIENS

Commissioner Pekas, County Aid Lien Liaison, briefed the Commission on a request to compromise DPNO 57546 in the amount of \$3,415.50 in full upon payment of \$854.00. The petitioners have suffered financial hardship and were in the process of selling their home when the lien for hospital services was noted by the title company. The applicants will realize a small profit from the sale of their home if the payment offer is accepted. MOTION by Pekas, seconded by Hajek to compromise DPNO 57546 in full upon payment of \$854.00. Zweep – aye, Hajek, Kolbe, Pekas, and Twedt – nay. Motion fails. Commissioner Twedt commented on the applicant's current financial and medical status. MOTION by Hajek, seconded by Pekas to approve Resolution MC05-58. 4 ayes, Zweep – nay.

MOTION by Pekas, seconded by Kolbe to release DPNO 29971 in the amount of \$3,074.34 in full upon payment of \$2,000.00 within 14 days. 5 ayes.

SUPPLEMENT

MOTION by Kolbe, seconded by Pekas to supplement from the Museum Grants Fund to the Museum Grants Budget \$1,400.00 (ASN 18982) and \$1,400.00 (ASN 18952) representing private grants for exhibits & education programming from the Siouxland Heritage Museum Alliance. 5 ayes.

BRIDGE

Gordy Swanson, Chief Civil Deputy State's Attorney, briefed the Commission on a bridge transfer that was approved on April 14, 1992. The bridge was no longer used by the public and was transferred to the abutting property owner, Aaron Munson. The transfer was done by resolution and agreement. Mr. Swanson was contacted by an attorney representing Mr. Munson and asked provide a Bill of Sale to complete the transaction. MOTION by Zweep, seconded by Kolbe to authorize the Chairman to sign a Bill of Sale for the transfer of bridge #50-262-225. 4 ayes, Hajek abstained.

HEARINGS

Scott Anderson, Planning Director, was present for the scheduled hearing to consider text amendments related to filing fees in the 1993 Subdivision Ordinance for Minnehaha County. The County Planning Commission recommended increasing the platting fees from \$20.00 plus \$5.00 per lot to \$100.00 plus \$25.00 per lot. Staff recommended an increase to \$250.00 plus \$25.00. Mr. Anderson explained that the

Planning Commission had concerns about persons paying higher fees for transfers, and then having to pay \$250.00 for platting the lot. Commissioner Hajek commented on the higher fees charged by Pennington and Lawrence counties. She felt the staff recommendations were appropriate. Commissioner Pekas noted that there are more rural residential issues brought before the Commission that are adding to staff time and costs. He thanked the Planning Commission for their recommendation, but noted that the increases in fees are a necessity as reflected during budget hearings. Commissioner Zweep asked Mr. Anderson to continue to review the fees annually. No one from the public spoke. MOTION by Hajek, seconded by Kolbe to approve Ordinance MC23-04-05 with the staff recommendations. 5 ayes.

ORDINANCE MC23-04-05

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE 1993 REVISED SUBDIVISION ORDINANCE FOR
MINNEHAHA COUNTY BY REVISING PLAT FILING FEES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY MINNEHAHA COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA:

That Ordinance MC23-93, the 1993 Revised Subdivision Ordinance for Minnehaha County is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1: That Section 3.00 is hereby amended to read as follows:

3.03 C) Filing Fee

The developer shall pay to the Planning Department a fee in the amount of \$250.00 for the plat plus \$25.00 for each lot shown on the plat or replat. Prior to release of the plat, the developer shall also pay for the cost of all road signs as specified in Section 8.01(C).

Mr. Anderson was also present for the scheduled hearing to consider zoning text amendments related to temporary uses and fees in the 1990 Revised Zoning Ordinance for Minnehaha County. Staff recommended fee increases related to Temporary Use Permits, Conditional Use Permits, Rezoning, Variances and Appeals, Zoning Permits, and Planned Developments. The County Planning Commission recommended that Temporary Use Permits remain at \$50.00 and be studied further, and that the Board of Adjustment be changed to \$100.00 rather than the proposed \$250.00. Mr. Anderson noted that the staff recommended fees were approved for the Joint Jurisdictional area with the City of Sioux Falls and he would like unanimity. MOTION by Kolbe, seconded by Hajek to approve Ordinance MC16-79-05 with the staff recommendations. 5 ayes.

ORDINANCE MC16-79-05

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE 1990 REVISED ZONING ORDINANCE FOR MINNEHAHA
COUNTY BY REVISING TEMPORARY USE PERMITS AND FILING FEES APPLICABLE TO
APPLICATIONS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY MINNEHAHA COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA:

That Ordinance MC16-90, the 1990 Revised Zoning Ordinance for Minnehaha County is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1: That Article 12.00 is hereby amended to read:

12.11 TEMPORARY USES (H) Fees. A fee of \$250.00 shall accompany the application for a temporary use permit.

Section 2: That Article 24.00 is hereby amended to read:

24.02 CHANGE OF ZONE. A fee of \$350.00 shall be charged for filing an application to change the zoning classification of property, except to the Planned Development District. If any use, for which a rezoning is required, is commenced prior to the application for a rezoning, the application fee shall be double the regular fee.

24.05 CONDITIONAL USE. A fee of \$250.00 shall be charged for filing an application for a conditional use permit in any district. If any use, for which a conditional use permit is required, is commenced prior to the application for a conditional use permit, the application fee shall be double the regular fee.

24.06 BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT. A fee of \$250.00 shall be charged for filing a Variance application or an appeal to the Zoning Board of Adjustment.

24.07 ZONING PERMIT. A fee of \$250.00 shall be charged for all zoning permits not requiring a building permit fee.

24.08 PLANNED DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT. A fee of \$350.00 plus \$50.00 for each subarea shall be charged for the filing of an application to change to the Planned Development District. If any use, for which a rezoning is required, is commenced prior to the application for a rezoning, the application fee shall be double the regular fee.

Phil Kappen, Assistant Planning Director, was present for the scheduled hearing to consider an amendment to the 1990 Revised Zoning Ordinance for Minnehaha County by rezoning from the A-1 Agricultural District to the I-1 Light Industrial District property legally described as the S 1220' of that portion of the NE1/4 of Section 12-T102N-R50W lying west of the I-29 ROW. Subject property is located one mile east of Crooks. The Planning Commission denied the request at their September 26th meeting because the request was not consistent with the County Comprehensive Plan and it would be difficult to access the site in emergency situations. The proposed lots would be accessed through an existing development resulting in ¾ mile single access road. Access from the north cannot be made because the property lies too close to the interstate overpass. The Comprehensive Plan allows for areas of commercial or industrial uses at interstate interchanges, in rural service areas, or small areas at the intersection of two highly traveled hard-surface roads for the purposes of serving the traveling public. Mr. Kappen noted that the property did not meet any of these criteria. Commissioner Hajek reported on discussion at the Planning Commission meeting and noted that this is a second request for this area and

was reduced from 70 to 40 acres. She also felt the area was suited for light industrial use. The petitioner indicated that the prior applicant was told by the Commission that the parcel was too large and to bring back a new application for the 40 acres. Scott Anderson, Planning Director, explained that Tom Ode was the prior applicant and when his application for the whole parcel was presented, the Commission was supportive of the smaller tract at that time. There were also several concerned neighbors at the meeting opposed to the development of the northern portion of the whole tract. Jim Dunham with the Dunham Company commented on how Dunham Company acquired the land. He stated that when the property was listed for sale, a potential buyer through his agent, Tom Ode, made application to rezone the entire 74 acre into I-1 Light Industrial. Mr. Dunham was told by the petitioner and the Planning Department that the proposed plan was rejected and that the county would be in support of an application containing a maximum of 40 acres. After that discussion, the applicant did purchase the property and application was made to rezone the south 40 acres to light industrial. He noted that the request is a natural future extension of the existing industrial park and that there is a need for inexpensive I-1 land near Sioux Falls. Most industrial parks contain large buildings and have minimal traffic. The northern 34 acres are under contract to be sold for residential use. The applicant, Don Dunham, noted that the property was purchased based on comments made by the prior applicant and Planning staff. Mr. Kappen reiterated that the request did not comply with the Comprehensive Development Plan. Don Dunham felt that the Comprehensive Development Plan should be used to regulate a development and should allow for some deviation. Donovan and Cassandra DeKrey, area residents, spoke in opposition to the request. The DeKreys land abuts the northern parcel being sold by the applicant. Mr. DeKrey was supportive of having a residence as a neighbor, but has seen advertising for the land as a whole parcel as light industrial. He also voiced concerns over how the drainage areas near the development would be impacted and future rezoning of the residential parcel. Jim Dunham stated that originally, prior to the first application, the parcel was to be sold as one, but that is no longer the case. He confirmed that the northern lot would remain residential. There was consensus amongst the Commission that the area was appropriate for light industrial use and would eventually be developed for that purpose. Commissioner Pekas thanked staff for following the Comprehensive Plan. He felt the proposal was consistent with the growth of Minnehaha County. Commissioner Kolbe noted that there are other potential areas within the county that meet the commercial use recommendations of the Comprehensive Plan. MOTION by Hajek, seconded by Pekas to approve Ordinance MC16-80-05. 4 ayes, Kolbe – nay.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE MC16-90 BY PROVIDING THAT THE WITHIN DESCRIBED PROPERTY BE REZONED:

BE IT ORDAINED BY MINNEHAHA COUNTY, SOUTH DAKOTA:

That Ordinance MC16-90 be amended by changing the zoning classification of property as follows:
 S 1220' of that portion of the NE1/4 of Section 12-T102N-R50W lying west of the I-29 ROW
 from the A-1 Agricultural District to the I-1 Industrial District.
